TASK

Step1: Read your chosen book within a 2-week time span and take notes as you read. Use the graphic organizer on the back of this page to take your notes.

Step 2: After reading your chosen book, write a 3 paragraph Reader's Response to the book.

- In the first paragraph, give a 5-6 sentence summary of the book.
- In the second paragraph, tell about your thinking while reading. This paragraph is all about showing your reading skills, like predicting, inferring, tracking character changes, noticing traits, motivations, and flaws, and analyzing themes. Choose at least 2 specific skills to focus on and use text evidence to support your observations. (Refer to the graphic organizer to add more details.)
- In the third paragraph, tell your opinion of the book, and explain in detail why you feel that way. Would you recommend it to a peer? Why or why not?

Bring your notes and response with you on the first day of school. Please include the reader's response rubric as well. We look forward to reading your amazing work!
